Here's a brief description of our Elearning courses:

### Monitored Dosage System

This Module is designed to enable the delegate to handle medicines safely through the correct implementation of the Boots Monitored Dosage System (MDS).

The system we will discuss in greatest detail is called MANREX, and there are other versions that we will cover during the course.

### Care of Medicines - Foundation

The Community Care Act was introduced in 1983 and built on by the Care Standards Act 2000, the Regulation of Care (Scotland) Act 2001 and The Health and Social Care Act 2008 (Regulated Activities) Regulations 2010. As a result, more people who were previously looked after in hospitals or institutions are now cared for in the community.

The course is accredited by the Royal Pharmaceutical Society and is designed to provide the delegate with underpinning knowledge for SVQ/NVQ Health & Social Care Levels 2 and 3 and Element 411d at Level 4. The course meets the knowledge skill set requirements issued by Skills for Care, and will support the administration of medication in line with essential standards for quality and safety and national care standards.

### Care of Medicines - Advanced

This course provides background information on all major organs of the body and on how they are affected by drugs. It builds on the Foundation module. Nurses may not need to do the Foundation course first.

This course is designed to provide the delegate with the knowledge they need to identify the effect of a range of different medication on the body, and to identify and deal effectively with problems such as Adverse Drug Reactions and Drug Interactions.

It also contains case studies designed to put all the learning in the module into practical use.

### Care of Medicines - Domiciliary

This course is designed to help staff in a Domiciliary Care environment work towards a vocational qualification on the Qualifications and Credit Framework. It provides key information on the administration and control of medicines and the essential knowledge that is required for delegates to safely monitor and, where required, administer medicines to the service users in their care.
